The Children and Young (Scotland) Act 2014 was passed in the Scottish Parliament on 19 February 2014 and received Royal Assent on 27 March 2014.

Appendix 1 provides a table of expected implementation dates for the major provisions relevant to the work of the Care Inspectorate, all of which are due to come into effect by the end of 2016.

Please note that the dates outlined are based on Scottish Government forecasts and may be subject to change.
